## ---- ROBOTICS GRANT

GLCS Foundation's support of Gull Lake Twisted Devils Robotics Teams is eight years strong, totaling over \$44,000. The program started small in 2012 with two teams (one HS and one MS) made up of 15 students. Twisted Devil Robotics now boasts 21 teams and includes Young-5's through 12th grade. Nearly 375 students and coaches have participated since 2012, earning 33 awards, including State and World tournament Championships. Cheryl Thornton, one of GL Robotics original mentors says, "We've had many students say they did not know what they wanted to do after high school before they joined robotics. Robotics gave them a direction for their future. 39

members of GL Robotics teams have gone on to study a STEM-related field. Also, notably, 95 percent of students that are on a Robotics team their senior year continue on to college, trade schools, or the military."

Patrick English, 3rd-grade teacher, Robotics coach, and lead grant-writer says, "GLCS Foundation's contribution to Robotics gives Gull Lake kids an opportunity to participate in hands-on learning which focuses on teamwork, communication, and problem-solving. They also learn 'Co-opertition'-where teams compete, and at the same time, learn to help each other-a unique and beneficial skill."

FIRST Robotics is a STEM-based learning approach, which inspires young people to be science and technology leaders and innovators by engaging them in exciting mentor-based programs. Students build science, engineering, and technology skills, and well-rounded life capabilities including teamwork, selfconfidence, and communication.



## SPARK SERIES: #GLWELL

The Spark Series #GLWELL focused on the well-being of our students, staff, and community, through two major events: the Jump with Jill Live Tour and Iraq combat veteran, author, and documentarian, Tom Voss.

The Jump with Jill Live Tour inspired over 1,400 K-5 students and staff to get up and move and eat right using motivational songs about the importance of good nutrition and physical activity.

Tom Voss spoke to several high school classrooms, visited veterans and staff at the VA Hospital, and addressed the community during a public event in March—meeting over 200 people and delivering to all his message of using resilience, trust, compassion, patience, and forgiveness to recover from trauma and manage stress.

The Foundation introduced #GLWELL and drove community engagement by posting healthy lifestyle tips and contests via

"The Pacing Innovation@GLMS program connects Gull Lake students to innovative best practices from global leaders and the latest development technology," said Matt Hawkins, STEAM/Project Lead the Way Teacher. "Ultimately, our students will learn to be innovative leaders who will connect with community businesses and organizations, showcasing their projects featuring empathetic designs that benefit someone other than themselves."

Collaboration is a big part of this program, and students share project updates and get feedback from fellow students. Knowledge is also gained via blogs, podcasts, TED talks, and videos from current, global innovators and from Gull Lake teachers' continuing education. This upcoming school year, this grant will provide tuition for a Gull Lake team, including Mr. Hawkins, Media Specialist Beth Keller, Middle School Principal Carmen Maring, and Director of Curriculum & Instructional Technology Drew Bordner, to attend the Learning & Leading Academy. Hosted by George Couros, AJ Juliani, and Katie Novak, the Academy is a professional leadership consortium that supports leaders in the systemic growth of innovative teaching and learning and building knowledge of innovative practices, resources, and research. Over 300 students were impacted by this grant in 2019/20. This number will increase as more staff are trained.

This program is supported by a five-year, up to \$25,000 grant from the Chris Rundle Innovation Fund for Educators, established in 2019 in honor of former Gull Lake Superintendent Chris Rundle, who valued and fostered innovation in education.

#### **EDUCATOR DEVELOPMENT GRANT:** A day with George Couros

Over 200 Gull Lake educators kicked off the 2019-20 year with an inspiring day of professional development, featuring leading author and educator in innovative teaching, learning, and leadership, George Couros! His presentation and break-out sessions on engaging students with innovative learning techniques reinvigorated and motivated our Gull Lake staff.

#### Stephanie Tenorio-Lares: 2020 Ryan Scholarship recipient!

Stephanie Tenorio-Lares is the 2020 recipient of the James R. Ryan Family Middle School Scholarship. She is the 19<sup>th</sup> Gull Lake Middle School student to benefit from this generous scholarship, awarded to an outstanding GL eighth-grader with a 3.5 GPA or higher and financial need in addition to other selection criteria. The scholarship provides \$10,000 annually for four years to earn an undergraduate degree.

This scholarship was initiated by Dr. James R. Ryan (1936-2006), an Orthopedic Oncology expert, who demonstrated a dedication to education throughout his entire life. His generous gift creates a legacy of assisting students in their efforts to realize their academic potential. When asked about how it feels to award the scholarship, Deb Ryan said,
